My love for Lincoln cars probably began at age 12, when one of my grade school teachers, Mrs. Hilken arrived at school one morning in a brand new 59 Lincoln Premiere, having traded her 56 Cadillac for the Lincoln. It was a beautiful gunmetal gray color with a black and white cloth interior and a trunk big enough to hold class in. I remember whenever there was a school field trip that required traveling by car, I always saw to it I had a spot in the front seat of that big Lincoln.

I purchased my 63 Lincoln in 1983 when I spotted an ad in the Bismarck Tribune listing a 1963 Lincoln Continental with 80,000 original miles on it. The car was located in nearby Washburn, North Dakota, about 45 miles Northwest of Bismarck. The owners of the car, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Whitlock had owned the car since new. They had been retired for several years already and wanted to sell the car, as they did not drive it very often anymore. I will always remember Mr. Whitlock's remark; "a car like this has to be stirred up every once in a while."

The engine had about 4,000 miles on an overhaul, so it really purred like a kitten. The air conditioner worked perfectly, as did all the electrical.

As you probably noticed in the picture, the car has 15-inch wheels and covers on it. Mr. Whitlock explained that when the 64 models came out

The Oldest Ford Dealership in the U.S. Tenvoorde Ford



J.W. Tenvoorde

To understand the Tenvoorde story, one must go back to the míd 1800's, when J.W. Tenvoorde relocated to St. Cloud from Indíana.

On Chrístmas Day, 1865 hís son, Stephen, was born. In 1895 Stephen established the city's first bicycle store. An early newspaper account reported: "For many years this store has enjoyed a very lucrative patronage from the fact, no doubt, that it carries only high grade bicycles, built on honor and of such materials that positíve guarantee en-

That same report went on to name Stephen Tenvoorde as "One of the best posted men in this busíness,, beíng a mechaníc of extraordinary ability. He has devoted many years to machine work and is consequently well versed on all things pertaining to repairing and rebuilding."

Despite his thriving business. Stephen had much bigger ideas. He turned his interest from two-wheeled vehicles to machines atop four wheels, and in 1899 was credited with bringing the first automobile to St. Cloud.

Many referred to Tenvoorde as a "daredevil" but to no avail, in 1899 he began selling cars from his bicycle shop. On March 21, 1903 Stephen signed an agreement, making his the second Ford

(Continued from page 4) dealership in the United States. At that time he also sold Oldsmobile, Saxon, Buick, Chandler and Oakland automobiles, but dropped all other lines and focused his attention on Ford exclusively.

Selling automobiles was no walk in the park. In hís fírst year as a Ford dealer he sold only one car, but that díd not dampen hís enthusíasm. He saw automobiles as more than a mere means of transportation, but a true adventure. Foreseeing the need for the automobíle, Stephen opened his first sales outlet ín 1910; a one story brick structure in Downtown St. Cloud. Just five years later there were more than 400 automobiles of 40 different makes and models in St. Cloud. Tenvoorde expanded his operatíon to ínclude a fíve car showroom and a servíce area, along with a body shop, the first one is St. Cloud.

Ford polishes its U.S. luxury brand

Lincoln crossover under way; Mark LT to end By Bryce G. Hoffman / The Detroit News

Ford Motor Co. is moving ahead with plans to build the Lincoln MKT, a stylish crossover that turned heads at the Detroit auto show in January. A Ford engineer who is working on the program, known internally as D472, said the design work is well under way but, officially, the company says it has not made a final decision on whether to green-light the MKT. On Friday, Ford told The Detroit News it planned to show a production prototype to a consumer panel the following day to further refine the design and figure out where to position the vehicle in the market.

"We're showing it in front of customers," Ford spokesman Mark Schirmer said. "The company is actively pursuing a luxury crossover for Lincoln." At the same time, The News has learned from a dealer source that Ford sent a letter to Lincoln franchise owners last month informing them that the company plans to stop production of the Lincoln Mark LT



pickup at the end of this model year. Ford confirmed the authenticity of the letter and said it is eliminating the luxury pickup to make room for a new high-end version of the F-150 called the Platinum Edition.

Both moves are part of an effort to refocus the Lincoln brand and make it a serious contender again in the luxury space -- first in the United States, then in select global markets.

Fixing Lincoln is a big part of CEO Alan Mulally's strategy for turning Ford around. While he has decided to sell off foreign luxury brands like Jaguar and Land Rover to focus the company's resources on rebuilding its core Blue Oval brand, Mulally said he believes Lincoln remains an important part of the Ford equation.

Lincoln sales were up more than 9 percent last year, bucking the trend at a company that has been unable to halt a decade-long decline in U.S. market share. "Lincoln has some momentum now," Schirmer said. "The future has to be a broad lineup of luxury products -- the right products in the right segments."

For many years, Lincolns were dismissed as rebadged Fords. The automaker be-

Stephen's son, Cy, started working for his father when he was just 12 years old. He began by sweeping floors and became an integral part of the business, upon becoming bookkeeper in 1921.

Cy attended business college and was found to have such a flair with numbers that he fíníshed hís courses ín two years.... unheard of at that tíme, as ít was a four year study. The Great Depression hit everyone hard. Money was tight and people could not afford the luxury of a new car, so Cy put all his efforts into service and Customer Care. Hís ratíonale was that if people couldn't buy new cars, he would make sure their existing vehicles were taken care of in the best manner possible.

Dealerships nationwide were losing business, as Service Stations and independent garages were popping up everywhere. In 1934 Cy opened a "Quick Service Station" on the corner of St. Germain and (Continued on page 7)

gan reviving the brand with vehicles like the MKZ and MKX, but they still bore a strong similarity to the Ford products on which they were based, the Fusion and the Edge. Later this year, Ford will begin shipping the first Lin-



coln in years that stands out as a distinctively different automobile: the MKS, its new flagship sedan. The MKT is based on the same underlying architecture as the new Ford Flex, but the two bear no resemblance.

"It's a very important vehicle for getting Ford back into that luxury segment and making Lincoln credible again," said analyst Erich

Merkle of IRN Inc. in Grand Rapids. "They haven't really had the right product for the market."

He tracks production plans for all of the major automakers and expects Ford to introduce the MKT in May 2009.

Jim Hall of 2935 Analytics LLP in Birmingham does not expect the MKT to be a major volume vehicle for Lincoln, but he said it is important because it is part of a segment that is still being defined. "It's a high-image niche vehicle that shows off the Lincoln face," he said. "The best thing that could happen for them is if they could pull buyers from areas they don't expect."

Ford is benchmarking the MKT against luxury three-row crossovers from brands like BMW and Infiniti. That is significant, because the concept Ford showed in Detroit was a spacious two-row crossover. Hall said the production version was always going to offer three rows of seating, which he said it needs to be competitive.

Forth Avenue. The facility offered a complete service center for all makes and models.

Both the Tenvoorde and Ford famílies suffered personal losses in 1943. Cy's Father Stephen, passed away, as did Edsel Ford. It was not the best time to take over the reins of the dealership, as no new vehicles were being produced. Instead, the automobile industry was cranking out tanks. planes and anything military related. Cy was forced to lay off all of his salespeople. He decided that íf ĥís busíness was to survíve he would have to díversífy. He decíded to tackle the engine rebuilding business. Business was booming. His shop was up and runníng 24-7. Used cars were repaired and put up for sale. Tenvoorde put all of his focus on selling service. Thru advertising, they encouraged people to keep their cars in good repair, and against all odds the company prospered. It reached a poínt where ít was rebuilding an average of 125 engines per month for auto owners as well as all other Automobile (Continued on page 8)

In an article published in 1977, commemorating 75 years in business, Cy reflected. "At the insistence of my friendly, competitive dealers. I began writing a series of newspaper ads urging motorists to help the war effort by maintaining their vehicles to conserve fuel, tires and other components needed by the armed forces." Ás unlíkely as ít may seem, the company was more profitable during the war than at any other time to date.

Tenvoorde built a larger facility in 1951. Despite the tough times in the 40's, Cy had put away enough money to pay cash for the construction of the new dealership.

One of the highlights for the Tenvoorde family occurred when Cy was asked to drive the four millionth Minnesotabuilt Ford out of the Twin Cities plant in St. Paul on April 14, 1976. Another noteworthy occasion of the 70's took place when ground was broken for a new facility on June 16. 1977. The (Continued on page 9)

No one knows what the future holds, but it's safe to say that if the same business principles are kept in place that were so wisely established by Stephen Tenvoorde so many years ago, more generations of Tenvoorde's will Continue to offer their cars to our loyal friends. Since granted the Ford franchise on March 21, 1903, to the present, Tenvoorde Ford remains the "Oldest Family Owned Ford Dealership in the World."
